1. Can you name the 6 FCC elders? How do they serve the church?

- 2. Read 1 Timothy 3:1-7.
- 3. Which of the qualifications stand out to you? Why?
- 4. In what way are these qualifications to be exhibited by all Christians?
- 5. Why can "above reproach" be considered the summary heading for this list?
- 6. Why is a man's family life indicative of how he would serve as an elder (v.5)?
- 7. What dangers might there be in making a new believer an elder (v.6)?
- 8. What is the "devil's trap" in 1Tim 3:7?
- 9. Read 1 Peter 5:1-4. What similarities exist with 1 Tim 3:1-7? What are some dangers/temptations for elders?

- 10. Review Acts 20:28. What reason is stated here for why God gave elders to the church? How would this help Timothy in Ephesus? (see 1 Tim 1:4)
- 11. Read 1 Peter 2:24-25. Why is it important to remember that Jesus is the Chief Shepherd?

- 12. Read Hebrews 13:17. How can your small group make this verse a reality?
- 13. How might any Christian use this list for themselves?
- 14. Which characteristic is one your group could pray about for you?
